

What is a Young Carers Emergency Contact Card?

The Young Carers Emergency Contact Card identifies you as being a Young Carer. It is the size of a credit card and fits easily into a purse, wallet or pocket. On the back it will have contact numbers of people you trust to be contacted in the case of an Emergency.

So if for some reason you can't get home in time to provide support to the person you help, one of your emergency contacts will be able to stand in for you.

Why should I have a Young Carers Emergency Contact Card?

A **Young Carers Emergency Contact Card** can be useful because:

- It ensures you have contacts in place, in case of an emergency.
- Can identify you as a Young Carer
- Gives peace of mind

It can help in school too. You will be able to show your card to a teacher or member of staff. It makes them aware that you are a Young Carer and that you are registered with **Wired Young Carers Service**. This can help them to understand your situation and any additional needs you may have in school.

How do I get a Young Carers Emergency Contact Card?

- If you are interested in getting a **Young Carers Emergency Contact Card** you would need to be registered with the service.
- You then need to fill in the brief form, and get your emergency contacts to sign to say they consent to being called in an emergency.
- Send this form back to us in the FREEPOST envelope provided.
- We will then issue you with your card.

What do I do when I've got my Young Carers Emergency Contact Card?

Once you have been issued with your **Young Carers Emergency Contact Card** all you have to do is keep it in a safe but handy place should you ever need to use it.

It is possible that none of your emergency contacts will ever need to be called, but at least having the card means that you have made a plan for you and the person you care for, should you need it.
